THESE PEOPLE are just some of the dozens of migrant families that you have helped. Most live in Philadelphia but you have also touched families in the homeland of some of these immigrants—in Honduras, Guatemala, Dominican Republic, Mexico, Afghanistan. You have helped them with clothing, furniture, food, medicines and medical help. You have helped them get to the doctor or dentist, to the clinic, to WIC, to Catholic Charities. You have helped them locate a church or mosque they could get to easily since most have no car. You have driven them to work, to the second-hand store, to the federal court building.

But, you say, when have I given them clothes, or food, or medical aid? When have I taken them to Catholic Charities or shown them where the nearest place of worship or clinic is?

You have helped with your donations of goods, with your tithes, with your monetary gifts. You have helped them with your prayers. You may have even greeted them in church.
